An Order for Night Prayer (Compline) Wednesday, 4th June 2025 St. Margaret in-the-Pines Anglican Church

The ancient office of Compline derives its name from a Latin word meaning 'completion' (completorium). It is above all a service of quietness and reflection before rest at the end of the day.

Opening

Officiant: The Lord almighty grant us a quiet night and a

perfect end.

All: Amen.

Officiant: Our help is in the name of the Lord

All: who made heaven and earth.

A period of silence for reflection on the past day may follow.

All: Most merciful God, we confess to you, before the

whole company of heaven and one an other, that we have sinned in thought, word and deed and in what we have failed to do. Forgive us our sins, heal us by your Spirit and raise us to new life in

Christ. Amen.

Officiant: O God, make speed to save us.

All: O Lord, make haste to help us.

All: Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the

Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning is now and

shall be for ever. Amen.

And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth.

Prayers

Intercessions and thanksgivings may be offered here.

Officiant: Let us pray to God the Holy Spirit saying, "Come,

Holy Spirit, come."

All: Come, Holy Spirit, come!

Officiant: Let us pray.

The Collect:

Lord of all truth and peace, you named your bishop John the servant of the servants of God and gave him wisdom to begin the work of renewing your Church. Grant that, after his example, we may extend our hands to other Christians to clasp them with the love of your Son, and labour among the nations of the world to kindle their desire for justice and peace; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

All: Amen.

Silence may be kept.

Leader: Rejoicing in the presence of God here among us,

as our Saviour taught us, so we pray,

All: Our Father who art in heaven,

Hallowed be thy Name,
Thy kingdom come,
Thy will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread; And forgive us our trespasses,

As we forgive them that trespass against us;

And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. Amen.

Closing

Officiant: In peace we will lie down and sleep;

All: for you alone, Lord, make us dwell in safety.

Officiant: Abide with us, Lord Jesus,

All: for the night is at hand and the day is now past.

Officiant: As the night watch looks for the morning,

All: so do we look for you, O Christ.

Officiant: May the Holy Spirit of God bless and sanctify us

so that we may be consecrated in the truth.

All: Amen. Alleluia!
